Academic English in the Lebanon High School summer program is designed to focus on the student's achieving a better understanding of all models of written and oral communication. This course emphasizes skills in literature, writing, speaking, and listening.

Objectives of this course include students studying effective models of literature, responding to written work through their own writing and speaking, creating their own written work, and speaking in small and large group settings. Written works primarily focus on students creating organized and grammatically correct assignments that not only carry out the assignment, but also fulfill the specific standards of effective writing. Students also apply research skills in both oral and written reports. Students apply basic speech techniques in coordination with course assignments.

**U.S.GOVERNMENT**

**GRADE 12**

**Time: 12:00 p.m.—4:00 p.m.**

Both the historic development and the present functions of our government are studied.

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## **MATHEMATICS**

Credit for one semester of any of the following courses can be earned in summer school to catch students up who failed due to absence or performance. Students who have not failed, but who performed poorly during the school year, can also audit these courses in their sequence.

### **ALGEBRA 1 B—2nd Semester** **Time: 7:30 a.m.—11:30 a.m.**

Algebra 1 provides a formal development of the algebraic skills and concepts necessary for students to succeed in advanced courses. In particular, the instructional program in this course provides for the use of algebraic skills in a wide range of problem solving situations. The concept of the function is emphasized throughout the course. Topics include: 1. operations with real numbers, 2. linear equations and inequalities. 3. relations and functions, 4. polynomials, 5. algebraic, 6. nonlinear equations.

### **ALGEBRA 2 B—2ND SEMESTER** **Time: 12:00 p.m.—4:00 p.m.**

Algebra 2 is a course that extends the content of Algebra 1 and provides further development of the concept and function. Topics will include: (1) relations, functions, equations and inequalities; (2) conic sections; (3) polynomials; (4) Algebraic functions; (5) logarithmic and exponential functions; (6) sequences and series; and (7) counting principles and probability.

### **GEOMETRY B—2nd Semester** **Time: 7:30 a.m.—11:30 a.m.**

Geometry is a course that examines the properties of two- and three-dimensional objects. Topics will include: (1) points, lines, angles, and planes; (2) polygons, with a special focus on quadrilaterals, triangles, and right triangle trigonometry; (3) circles; (4) polyhedra and other solids. Mathematical reasoning and logic is used throughout.
