REOPENING 2021–22

Movement to a lower phase will be determined by:

- Positive COVID case rate (individual school or district);
- Quarantine rate (individual school or district);
- Staffing levels including: transportation, food service, custodial/ maintenance, instructional, clerical, nursing;

AND through consultation with the public health agencies:

- IDOH risk color level for Boone County.
- Vaccination percentage of 5-18-year-old population residing in LCSC zip codes.
- Age 5-11 vaccine availability
- Trend in new cases in Boone County per 100K residents.
- Trend in county positivity rate.

2021-22 RETURN TO IN-PERSON INSTRUCTION

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DISTRICT PRECAUTIONS

- Plexiglass installed in offices and points of sale
- UV-C light source sanitizing devices
- Additional air filtration
- Additional custodial staff
- Staff training
- Staff and students encouraged to bring hand sanitizer
- Increased inventory of hand sanitizer, sanitizing stations
- Build in hand-washing to daily routines and time for hand sanitizer
- Water bottle filling stations
- Daily screener as part of student registration

DISTRICT PRECAUTIONS IN REVIEW

- Meal Service
- Transportation
- Recess
- Passing Periods
- School Visitors and Volunteers
- Extra Curricular Activities and Other After School Events

MASKS AND FACE COVERINGS

- Students, staff, and visitors will make their personal informed choice regarding the use of a mask or face covering in all school buildings and on school transportation.
- If IDOH contact tracing requirements resume, decisions will be reviewed on Wednesdays and communicated to continue or change the following Monday.

MASKS AND FACE COVERINGS

Masks could again become required in an individual school and/or the entire district if IDOH contact tracing requirements resume and when the total number of quarantined students (individual school or district) is $\geq 3\%$, and the number of student positive cases is $\geq 2\%$ for two consecutive weeks and any combination of factors below are in place:

- 1. The school or district is unable to maintain staffing levels (transportation, food service, clerical, instructional staff, custodial and maintenance, nursing) necessary to support a safe and effective learning and working environment;
- 2. Upon recommendation or directive of public health agency, or Governor's order.

CLOSE CONTACTS AND QUARANTINE REQUIREMENTS

- The district will identify close contacts to positive COVID-19 cases and close contacts according to the IDOH requirements and apply required quarantine measures.
- Asymptomatic close contacts who are vaccinated or recovered from a COVID-19
 infection within the past 90 days are not required to quarantine and asked to monitor for
 COVID-19 symptoms.
